

Iquitos, Peru: Canopy Walkways & Ancient Forests—December 20-31, 2014 with Pepe Rojas & Dan Lane. An immersion in the most species-rich region of Amazonia, including the white-sand forests near lquitos. River travel on the Amazon and Napo rivers, canopy access via the famed walkway at ACTS (Amazon Conservatory of Tropical Studies).

Arizona Winter Specialties—December 27, 2014-January 2, 2015 with Dave Stejskal. Exceptional winter birding on a short tour with numerous specialties and potential rarities.

Panama's Canopy Lodge: El Valle de Anton—December 27, 2014-January 3, 2015 with John Rowlett & local guide. A superb introduction to Neotropical birds or a complement to your broader Middle American birding, all based at a charming lodge.

Holiday Costa Rica: Rancho Naturalista— December 27, 2014-January 4, 2015 with Chris Benesh & local guide. One-site holiday tour based at the comfortable Rancho Naturalista Lodge, with excursions to other habitats on Costa Rica's bird-rich Caribbean slope.

Trinidad & Tobago—December 27, 2014-January 5, 2015 with guide TBA. Wonderful introductory birding tour to South America's riches, including bellbirds, toucans, manakins, and motmots.

Holiday in Honduras: The Lodge at Pico Bonito—December 29, 2014-January 3, 2015 with Jesse Fagan & local guide. A holiday birding tour over New Year's based in a lovely and bird-rich setting at The Lodge at Pico Bonito.

FRESH FROM THE FIELD

Colombia's amazing Andes are the focus of our Colombia: The Cauca Valley, Western & **Central Andes** tour, which zigs and zags its way across the Cauca Valley from Cali to Medellin, seeing some wonderful birds along the way. Among them this year were the Chestnut-breasted Chlorophonia at top, an obvious aesthetic highlight; the gorgeous Green-crowned Brilliant and Bearded Helmetcrest (two of more than forty hummers on the tour); and the widespread but seldom seen Lanceolated Monklet, above right. For the past few years, the migrant Kirtland's Warbler has been featured on Jesse Fagan's Bahamas: Abaco, Eleuthera & Kirtland's Warbler tour, where the warbler winters. Bahama Yellowthroat, on the other hand, another lovely warbler shown at top left, doesn't get around much. It's endemic to the islands, while the Cuban Parrot and West Indian Woodpecker are restricted to just Cuba and the Bahamas. (Photos by guide Jesse Fagan)





Terry Stevenson's East Africa Highlights: Kenya & Tanzania tour recorded just under 500 species of birds and more than 50 of mammals and spent a little time visiting the locals, in this case a Masai village in Tanzania. The White Rhinos, above left, have just stepped out of a mud bath; the Cinnamon-chested Bee-eater, center, is a bird you want to see again and again, which fortunately is possible along the tour route; and it's easy to see why the Helmeted Guineafowl was a tour favorite. The Giant Ibis (at right) could hardly be described as a handsome bird, but it is a rare one and, with the exception of a small population in Laos, Cambodia is the last place to see it, and perhaps as importantly, to hear at dawn its evocative bugling duet. White-rumped Falcon is another range-restricted species seen well on the tour, as guide Phil Gregory's photo at left confirms. A Santa Marta endemic, the gorgeous Black-cheeked Mountain-Tanager at top is just one of 33 endemics seen on our Colombia: Bogota, the Magdalena Valley & Santa Marta tour,



though the tanager might win the beauty contest. Recurve-billed Bushbird (center) is also a bird of limited range and usually not seen this well; indeed it went unseen from 1965 to 2004! Mitch Lysinger, reporting on his **Holiday at San Isidro** tour, commented on the great looks his group had of Giant Conebill in the high elevation Polylepis forests near Papallacta Pass, and the photo at upper left backs him up. The other three species pictured here—Speckled Hummingbird above (the runt at the feeders), the splendid Green Violetear (near left), and



r (near left), and the is-it-for-real Andean Cock-ofthe-rock—are a few of Mitch's tenants at San Isidro and are likely to put in an appearance there. (Photos by participant Don Taves)






There's rarely a dull moment in the rainforest-if you know what to look for, as participant

In May, Field Guides will defend the title in the third *World Birding Challenge* in northern Peru. We will be represented by Rose Ann Rowlett, Richard Webster, Marcelo Padua, and (hang on to your hats!) Terry Stevenson! Of course, with Rose Ann and Richard on board—who have been guiding our Northern Peru tour for almost 20 years now—we expect to be competitive. Marcelo and Terry are new to Peru but are studying hard and will contribute that FG energy and humor for which they are well known.

The team is again birding for conservation bucks and we encourage FOFG (friends of Field Guides) to contribute either per species (they will be aiming for over 600!) seen or a dollar amount. Especially those of you who have traveled with these guides in the past are encouraged to show your support! All donations generated will be directed to the BirdLife affiliate in Peru, Apeco. Apeco works to preserve and protect the habitat in northern Peru of the iconic hummingbird, the Marvelous Spatuletail *Loddigesia mirabilis*, a Peruvian endemic listed as endangered on the current Red List. With its wonderfully extravagant spatulate tail and male courtship dances, this superb hummingbird is a flagship species for the forests in the higher part of the micro-watersheds of the Tilacancha and Cruzhuayco rivers. The Apeco campaign supports a community reserve, the Private Conservation Area of Tilacancha, by raising its profile and encouraging the creation of reciprocal agreements for watershed conservation between users and land owners.
