**COLOMBIA'S INÍRIDA: LAND OF MANY WATERS**  
*November 21 - 29, 2026*

We include here information for those interested in the 2026 Colombia's Inírida: Land of Many Waters tour:

- a general introduction to the tour
- a description of the birding areas to be visited on the tour
- an abbreviated daily itinerary with some indication of the nature of each day's birding outings

Those who register for the tour will be sent this additional material:

- a detailed information bulletin with important logistical information and answers to questions regarding accommodations, air arrangements, clothing, currency, customs and immigration, documents, health precautions, and personal items
- a Field Guides checklist for preparing for and keeping track of the birds we see on the tour
- after the conclusion of the tour, a list of birds seen on the tour.

Field Guides continues to explore and develop new itineraries in the bird-rich country of Colombia. This new offering visits the extreme eastern part of the country, a sort of transition zone between Amazonian and *llanos*-savanna-rich avifaunas, as well as a distinctive mix of range-restricted Orinocan basin specialties. The tour is based in the bustling town of Puerto Inírida, located 30 km from the border with Venezuela, at the confluence of the Inírida River and Guaviare River. Puerto Inírida is the capital city of the Guainía department, locally known in the Yuri language as "Land of Many Waters" because of its powerful waterways. With over 500 species recorded in the area, this tour will sample some of the best white-sand and *terra firme* forest habitats that Colombia has to offer. We will target several limited-range species like Yapacana Antbird, Spot-backed Antwren, Yellow-crowned Manakin, Azure-naped Jay, Orinoco Piculet, Orinoco Softtail, and White-naped Seedeater, plus look for a recently discovered yet-to-be-described *Thamnophilus* antshrike, "Inirida Antshrike." In addition to these species, there are a host of other must-see birds like Ruby-topaz Hummingbird,

Capuchinbird, both Purple-breasted and Pompadour cotingas, Black Manakin, Spotted Puffbird, Brown, Bronzy, and Paradise jacamars, Bare-necked Fruitcrow, Plumbeous Euphonia, and Opal-rumped and Flame-crested Tanagers. It is easy to see that there is a real mix of species here, but many of the target species and highlights to this region are white-sand forest specialists or have Guianan Shield origins. However, there are other appealing aspects of Inírida with respect to the scenery (the spectacular Mavecure “hills”), regional culture and indigenous groups (like the Curipaco Indians), and local food, including grilled *sapuare* (a river fish) with garlic, among other delicacies.

*We want to be sure you are on the right tour! Below is a description of the physical requirements of the tour. If you are concerned about the difficulty, please contact us about this and be sure to fully explain your concerns. We want to make sure you have a wonderful time with us, so if you are uncomfortable with the requirements, just let us know and we can help you find a better fitting tour! Field Guides will not charge you a change or cancellation fee if you opt out within 10 days of depositing.*

### **Physical requirements of this tour**

- **POTENTIAL CHALLENGES:** We will have two full days (to the Mavecure Hills and Orinoco River) where our transportation will be mostly by boat, around 4 – 5 hours round trip. On other days, we will venture out on long dug-out canoes or small boats with outboard motors to explore other trails or bird from the boat.
- **PACE:** After breakfast (usually at 5:00-5:30 a.m.), we bird until lunch time. We often will *siesta* for a couple of hours during the hottest part of the day. The pace will be a typical birder’s pace that combines short periods of traveling to destinations with good bits of walking and standing around as we wait for birds to show themselves. We will stay out until dark at least one night for nightbirds.
- **WEATHER:** Inírida is hot (in late November and December, an average high of 89 F) and humid, and rain can occur at any time.

- **ELEVATION:** We will be at 8,600 feet in Bogota at the beginning and end of the tour. Inírida is 295 feet above sea level.
- **VEHICLE SEATING:** Our vehicles in Inírida will be a mix of small tuk-tuks (or mototaxis) and a van. We will employ a rotation system so that participants will have a chance to choose which vehicle they would like to ride in for the day. Thankfully, distances are short.
- **BATHROOM BREAKS:** Participants should be prepared to make comfort stops in nature, as there are simply no other options (away from our lodgings) on many sections of this tour's route.
- **OPTING OUT:** Where we are staying multiple days in the same lodging, participants can opt to sit out a day or sometimes a half-day. This will not be possible on days when we are changing locations.

If you are uncertain about whether this tour is a good match for your abilities, please don't hesitate to contact our office; if they cannot directly answer your queries, they will put you in touch with the guide for the tour.

## About the Birding Areas

**Inírida**—Distances are relatively short. The habitat surrounding the town varies quite quickly from mostly white-sand forest in the uplands to *varzea* forest along the river and stream courses. We will bird several different locations over 5.5 days of birding, sampling the different habitats to make the most of our experience. On longer days will travel by boat for about 2-hours to visit the gorgeous Mavecure Hills and the Orinoco River.



## Itinerary for Colombia's Inírida: Land of Many Waters

**Day 1, Sat, 21 Nov. Arrival in Bogotá.** Most flights from North America arrive in the evening; transfers will be scheduled from the airport to our hotel in Bogotá. Those who wish to adjust for a day or two or visit Bogotá attractions, such as the Gold Museum (Museo del Oro), will need to schedule an earlier arrival. Our local ground operator in Bogotá can also help to arrange day visits with a local guide to the old colonial town of La Candelaria, Simon Bolivar Central Park, or a cable-car ride up Mount Monserrate with stunning views of the city below. Night in Bogotá (8600 feet).

**Day 2, Sun, 22 Nov. Bogotá to Inírida.** We will aim for the earliest flight to Inírida. Currently, the only commercial flights available are with the government-run Satena. We are hopeful that more competition in the future will give us better options for our flight schedule. Regardless, after our arrival, we will meet our local guide, get checked into the hotel, have lunch, and spend our first afternoon birding several side roads near the hotel. Night in Puerto Inírida.

**NOTE: The day-to-day itinerary below is a rough idea of what we will do. We might make changes in the order of locations, depending on weather conditions (or water levels) and suggestions from our local guide.**

**Day 3, Mon, 23 Nov. Las Sabanitas and the Caño Carbon Trail.** We will have an early breakfast around 5:15 a.m. and depart afterward for Las Sabanitas. We will bird this site the entire morning with an arranged local lunch in the community. Species possible include Striped Woodcreeper, Ruby-topaz Hummingbird, Yellow-crowned Manakin, Spot-backed Antwren, Black-chinned Antbird, and Capuchinbird (rare). We will return to the hotel for some downtime and offer an outing in the late afternoon (like Caño Cheo). Night in Puerto Inírida.

**Day 4, Tue, 24 Nov. La Matraca.** After breakfast, we will drive to the Inírida River and take a boat about 10 minutes upriver to the trailhead for La Matraca. This trail wanders through taller *terra firme* forest. We will spend most of the morning here and return for lunch. In the afternoon, we will visit a white-sand forest site, Caño Vitina, and stay out until dark. Night in Puerto Inírida.

**Day 5, Wed, 25 Nov. Orinoco River.** A full day down the Guaviare River to its confluence with the Orinoco River. We will travel down the Orinoco River to a river island, Isla Orjuela. One of our targets here will be the Rio Orinoco Spinetail. We will lunch at Caño Jota with some afternoon birding (and chances of Orinoco Piculet and Butterfly Coquette). We will return in the late afternoon. Night in Puerto Inírida.

**Day 6, Thu, 26 Nov. Caño Vitina and La Rompida.** We will depart early for more white-sand forest birding at Caño Vitina. Early birding here will give us better chances at cotingas (Purple-breasted, Spangled, and Pompadour), possibly Capuchinbird, Ypacana Antbird, Campina Thrush, among many others. We will return for lunch and a short siesta. In the afternoon, we will load up into the boat for a trip to La Rompida. Night in Puerto Inírida.

**Day 7, Fri, 27 Nov. Mavecure Hills.** We will depart early in the morning by boat for the two-hour trip downriver to the Mavecure Hills. The three large rock formations that form the hills are called *Pajarito* (Little Bird), *Mono* (Monkey), and *Mavicuri* ("blowgun of the mountains"). We will spend a couple of hours here (with some birding!) and return midday for lunch. Our afternoon birding will depend on what we are missing and what sites offer more new birds! Night in Puerto Inírida.

**Day 8, Sat, 28 Nov. Return to Bogota.** Depending on our flight time, we often have time for some early morning birding before heading to the airport. Night in Bogota.

**Day 9, Sun, 29 Nov. International flights home.** You can schedule your flights home any time today. Safe Travels!

## About Your Guide

**Jesse Fagan** (a.k.a. the Motmot or just “Mot”) has been passionate about birds since his teens, when he had an encounter with a flying Pileated Woodpecker. He has birded throughout the United States, including spending seven years in Texas, and since 1995 has been birding and, for a time, living in northern Central America. He is a co-author of the recently published [\*Peterson Field Guide to Birds of Northern Central America\*](#) (Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, 2016), a field guide to the region which includes the countries of Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras, and Belize.

## Other Things You Need to Know

**TOUR MANAGER:** The manager for this tour is Nicole Cannon. Nicole will be happy to assist you in preparing for the tour. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to call her!

**ACCOMMODATIONS:** In Bogota, we will stay at a modern hotel with all the expected conveniences, including air conditioning, hot water, and WiFi. There is also an on-site restaurant. In Puerto Inírida, we will stay at a small but comfortable hotel called Hotel Fuentes de Guanía. The hotel has basic but clean rooms with air conditioning, plus a small garden and an on-site restaurant. The owner, Marta, takes good care of birders, offering early coffee and breakfast for us. There is WiFi in the reception area.

**A NOTE ON ALTITUDE:** Bogota sits at 8,660 feet (2,640 meters), and we spend a couple of nights in Bogota, so you should bring appropriate medication if you think you will have problems with the altitude; consult your physician.

The Inírida portion of the tour is at or near sea level.

**LUGGAGE:** Please limit your luggage to one medium-sized suitcase/duffel and one carry-on.

**AIR ARRANGEMENTS:** This tour begins and ends in Bogotá, Colombia (El Dorado International Airport, BOG).

**Arrival:** Bogotá (BOG) on November 21 at any time. We recommend arriving early and can assist with extra arrangements.

**Departure:** Bogotá (BOG) on November 29 at any time.

Please wait to purchase airline tickets until we notify you that the tour is confirmed to operate. At that time, we'll be glad to assist with your flight arrangements at no service fee.

**DOCUMENTS:** Be sure to verify the latest entry requirements for each country you will visit or transit.

**Passport:** A valid passport is required for international travel. It should be in good condition, valid for at least 6 months beyond your return date, and have at least one blank page for each country on your itinerary.

**Visa:** U.S. and Canadian citizens are not required to obtain a visa. Non-US citizens should consult the consulates of each destination for current entry requirements.

**TOUR INCLUSIONS/EXCLUSIONS: The tour fee is \$4875 for one person in double occupancy from Bogota.**

It includes all lodging from Day 1 through Day 8, all meals from breakfast on Day 2 through breakfast on Day 9, the flights within Colombia (Bogota – Inírida - Bogota), all ground transportation, entrance fees, and the guide services of the tour leader. Tipping at group meals and for drivers, porters, and local guides is included in your tour fee and will be handled for the group by your Field Guides leader(s). However, if you would like to recognize your Field Guides leader(s) or any local guide(s) for exceptional service, it is entirely appropriate to tip. We emphasize that such tips are optional and not expected.

**The above fee does not include** your airfare to and from Colombia, airport taxes, visa fees, any checked or carry-on baggage charges imposed by the airlines, any alcoholic beverages, optional tips to local drivers, phone calls, laundry, or other items of a personal nature.

**The single supplement is \$350 for those requesting a single room.** If you do not have a roommate but wish to share, we will try to pair you with a roommate from the tour; but if none is available, you will be billed for the single supplement. Our tour fees are based on double occupancy; one-half the cost of a double room is priced into the tour fee. The single supplement is calculated by taking the actual cost of a single room and subtracting one-half the cost of a double room (plus any applicable taxes).

**TOUR REGISTRATION: To register for this tour, please contact us at [fieldguides.com/contact-us/](https://fieldguides.com/contact-us/).** Our office will be in touch with you by email by the next business day (Mon-Fri) with instructions on how to complete our electronic registration form and medical questionnaire. (We are no longer accepting the paper version.)

**Please send your deposit of \$500 per person,** see <https://fieldguides.com/payment-options/> for our Payment Options. **Full payment of the tour fee is due 180 days prior to departure or by May 25, 2026.** We will bill you for the final payment at either 180 days or when the tour has reached sufficient subscription to operate, whichever date comes later. Since the cost of your trip insurance and airline tickets is generally non-refundable, please do not finalize these purchases until you have received final billing for the tour or have been advised that the tour is sufficiently subscribed to operate by your tour manager.

**SMOKING:** Almost all of our clients prefer a smoke-free environment. If you smoke, please be sensitive to the group and refrain from smoking at meals, in vehicles, and in proximity to the group on trails and elsewhere.

**CANCELLATION POLICY:** Refund of deposit and full payment, less \$100 handling fee, will be made if cancellation is received up to 180 days before departure. If cancellation occurs between 179 and 90 days before the departure date, 50% of the full tour fee is non-refundable, which would include the full deposit if the final payment has not yet been paid. Thereafter, all deposits and payments are not refundable and non-transferable.

Our cancellation policy only applies to payments made to Field Guides for tour (and any services included in those fees). Airline tickets not included in the tour fee and purchased separately often carry penalties for cancellation or change, or are sometimes totally non-refundable. Additionally, if you take out trip insurance the cost of that insurance is not refundable, so it is best to purchase the policy just prior to making full payment for the tour or at the time you purchase airline tickets, depending upon the airline's restrictions.

The right is reserved to cancel any tour prior to departure. In most such cases, full refund will constitute full settlement to the passenger. Note this exception, however: If you have been advised pre-tour that there is a non-refundable portion of your tour fee no matter the reason for Field Guides cancellation of the tour, that portion will not be refunded. The right is reserved to substitute in case of emergency another guide for the original one.

**TRIP CANCELLATION & MEDICAL EMERGENCY INSURANCE:** We strongly recommend purchasing trip cancellation (including medical emergency) insurance to protect your investment in case of injury or illness to you or an immediate family member before or during a trip. Because we must remit early and substantial deposits to our suppliers, we cannot

offer refunds for cancellations outside of our Cancellation Policy. If a participant is unable to join or continue a tour due to illness, all related expenses will be their responsibility, and no refunds can be issued for missed days. Please wait to purchase insurance until we notify you that the tour is confirmed to operate, as most policies are non-refundable.
