Part One of the 2014 Australia tour was a whirlwind of excitement spanning much of the southern tier of Australia. We explored many of the varied and temperate landscapes found there and experienced a nice cross-section of down under weather. Some of the weather was wild enough to make national news headlines but, fortunately for us, it seldom hampered our birding.

Highlights were many, including the cooperative flock of Freckled Ducks seen in Melbourne, the crazy display of the Musk Duck, the elegant dance-like display of Great Crested Grebe, the Great-winged Petrel wheeling around in the high winds in Albany, nice encounters with rare Square-tailed and Black-breasted kites, a lake full of Banded Stilts, beautiful Hooded Plovers, an Australian Owllet-Nightjar peering out of its roost hole, the cackle of Kookaburra, flashy Rainbow Bee-eaters, each of the black-cockatoos that were magic in their own way, the Gang-gangs and Major Mitchell's, all of those other wonderful and diverse parrots, the colorful fairywrens, a huge assortment of honeyeaters, the distinctive sound of Eastern Whipbird, the lovely song of the Pied Butcherbird, colorful robins, and a couple of gorgeous firetails. On top of that, some great mammals and herps rounded out the experience.

I want to thank our drivers, especially Dianne and Alan, who took such good care of us (not to mention Alan's barbie skills). And thanks to all of you for making the tour a pleasure to lead.

PHEASANT COUCAL (*Centropus phasianinus*) – Mostly heard but glimpsed along the Mt. Bass trail at Royal NP.

Strigidae (Owls)

POWERFUL OWL (*Ninox strenua*) – After striking out at the Royal Botanic Garden, we lucked out with a family group at Lane Cove NP. [E]

Aegothelidae (Owlet-Nightjars)

AUSTRALIAN OWLET-NIGHTJAR (*Aegotheles cristatus*) – We had great views of one peering out from its roost hole in Royal NP despite the weather.

Podargidae (Frogmouths)

TAWNY FROGMOUTH (*Podargus strigoides*) – Thanks to Graeme for showing us the pair at Little Desert Lodge. Another was hunting at night in Dryandra Woodland.

Alcedinidae (Kingfishers)

AZURE KINGFISHER (*Ceyx azureus*) – A lovely individual along the Hacking River in Royal NP.

Cacatuidae (Cockatoos)

RED-TAILED BLACK-COCKATOO (*Calyptorhynchus banksii*) – The last new bird of the trip, we enjoyed some time with a flock in birds right in the Perth area. [E]
YELLOW-TAILED BLACK-COCKATOO (*Calyptorhynchus funereus*) – Good flyovers and great looks at a couple of perched birds in the Grampians. [E]
CARNABY'S BLACK-COCKATOO (*Calyptorhynchus latirostris*) – Memorable and comical views of this species in the Dryandra Woodland. Named after Keith Carnaby, an entomologist who specialized in jewel beetles. [E]
BAUDIN'S BLACK-COCKATOO (*Calyptorhynchus baudinii*) – We eventually tracked down a good sized flock of this right in Margaret River. This rare bird is named for Nicolas Baudin, who commanded a French scientific expedition to Australia but who died before his return to France. Described as "appallingly rude and uncongenial." [E]
GANG-GANG COCKATOO (*Callocephalon fimbriatum*) – It was a good year for this species with good views right in Hall's Gap. [E]
PINK COCKATOO (*Lophochroa leadbeateri*) – Also known as Major Mitchell, we had a close encounter with this species at Hattah-Kulkyne NP. Named for Sir Thomas Mitchell, a Scottish soldier who explored interior Australia. [E]

CRIMSON ROSELLA (ADELAIDE) (*Platycercus elegans adelaidae*) – This is an intermediate form that we saw near our hotel in Adelaide. [E]

MUSK LORIKEET (*Glossopsitta concinna*) – Buzzing around in the park near our hotel in Adelaide. [E]

SUPERB LYREBIRD (*Menura novaehollandiae*) – We lucked into one as it was crossing the road in front of us at Royal NP. [E]

RED-WINGED FAIRYWREN (*Malurus elegans*) [E]

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS

Other terrestrial vertebrates:

Shingleback (*Tiliqua rugosa*) - quite a few of these seen in the interior, a rough and tumble skink.

Sand/Gould's Goanna (*Varanus gouldii*) - Graeme spotted one ducking into a log and tore into the log to reveal this guy and a shingleback.

Mallee Military Dragon (*Ctenophorus fordi*) - a few of these small lizards scurrying around the spinifex/mallee woodland at Hattah-Kulkyne.

Central Bearded Dragon (*Pogona vitticeps*) - a couple of these well seen in the interior.

Water Dragon (*Intellagama lesueurii*) - a couple of nice studies of this big lizard along the Hacking River in Royal NP.

Macquarie Turtle (*Emydura macquarii*) - seen sunning itself on a log at Royal NP.
