The first Rio Grande Rarities trip of 2014 was a success despite it being a relatively quiet year for rarities. Probably the most notable bird event of the season was the rediscovery of a small group of Hook-billed Kites near Mission, Texas. Five birds in total were found spending the winter here feeding on tree snails. Other highlights included having wonderful views of a pair of Aplomado Falcons near the coast and a cooperative Tropical Parula in Edinburg. Finally, we were able to track down a male White-collared Seedeater in Laredo, which was a treat for all.

I'd like to thank Tiffany Kersten for her help on a couple days of the trip. Thanks also to all of you for making the trip such a joy to lead. You were great cast of characters and I look forward to birding with all of you again in the future. Until then, good birding!

<u>Trochilidae (Hummingbirds)</u> **RUFOUS HUMMINGBIRD** (Selasphorus rufus) – One was seen by Jay and Alex. **BUFF-BELLIED HUMMINGBIRD** (Amazilia yucatanensis)

<u>Alcedinidae (Kingfishers)</u> RINGED KINGFISHER (Megaceryle torquata) BELTED KINGFISHER (Megaceryle alcyon) GREEN KINGFISHER (Chloroceryle americana)

GOLDEN-FRONTED WOODPECKER (Melanerpes aurifrons) **LADDER-BACKED WOODPECKER** (Picoides scalaris)

 NORTHERN BEARDLESS-TYRANNULET (Camptostoma imberbe) – Great looks at one present at Santa Ana national wildlife refuge.
 EASTERN PHOEBE (Sayornis phoebe)
 VERMILION FLYCATCHER (Pyrocephalus rubinus)
 GREAT KISKADEE (Pitangus sulphuratus)
 TROPICAL KINGBIRD (Tyrannus melancholicus) – At this season, Tropicals far outnumber Couch's in the valley.
 COUCH'S KINGBIRD (Tyrannus couchii) – We did eventually track one down at Anzalduas Park. Another pair was seen in North Central Park in Laredo.

<u>Polioptilidae (Gnatcatchers)</u> BLUE-GRAY GNATCATCHER (Polioptila caerulea)

<u>Regulidae (Kinglets)</u> RUBY-CROWNED KINGLET (Regulus calendula)

<u>Turdidae (Thrushes and Allies)</u> CLAY-COLORED THRUSH (Turdus grayi) – Two of these were present at Santa Ana NWR. AMERICAN ROBIN (Turdus migratorius) – Seeing American Robin in the Valley is not an everyday experience.

Mimidae (Mockingbirds and Thrashers) GRAY CATBIRD (Dumetella carolinensis) – A couple of these were present at the convention center on SPI. CURVE-BILLED THRASHER (Toxostoma curvirostre) LONG-BILLED THRASHER (Toxostoma longirostre) NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD (Mimus polyglottos)

<u>Sturnidae (Starlings)</u> EUROPEAN STARLING (Sturnus vulgaris) [I] <u>Motacillidae (Wagtails and Pipits)</u> AMERICAN PIPIT (Anthus rubescens)

Parulidae (New World Warblers) ORANGE-CROWNED WARBLER (Oreothlypis celata) NASHVILLE WARBLER (Oreothlypis ruficapilla) COMMON YELLOWTHROAT (Geothlypis trichas) TROPICAL PARULA (Setophaga pitiayumi) – We really worked for this one. But we eventually all had great looks at this rare species. YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLER (MYRTLE) (Setophaga coronata coronata) YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLER (AUDUBON'S) (Setophaga coronata auduboni) – Once we were as far west as Laredo, some of the warblers were Audubon's. YELLOW-THROATED WARBLER (Setophaga dominica)

BLACK-THROATED GRAY WARBLER (Setophaga nigrescens) – What a stunning male in the mixed flock in Laredo.

WILSON'S WARBLER (Cardellina pusilla) [*]

Fringillidae (Siskins, Crossbills, and Allies) HOUSE FINCH (Haemorhous mexicanus) LESSER GOLDFINCH (Spinus psaltria) AMERICAN GOLDFINCH (Spinus tristis)

Passeridae (Old World Sparrows) HOUSE SPARROW (Passer domesticus) [I]

MAMMALS

EASTERN COTTONTAIL (Sylvilagus floridanus)
FOX SQUIRREL (Sciurus niger)
HISPID COTTON RAT (Sigmodon hispidus) – Seen at the feeders in Salineno.
BLACK RAT (Rattus rattus) – The rat we saw feeding at Santa Ana keys out to be a brown morph of this species, based in part on the length of its tail.
COYOTE (Canis latrans) [*]
WHITE-TAILED DEER (Odocoileus virginianus) – Nice looks at a couple at North Central Park including a 10 point buck.
