# **BIRDS**

Anatidae (Ducks, Geese, and Waterfowl)

BLACK-BELLIED WHISTLING-DUCK (Dendrocygna autumnalis)

FULVOUS WHISTLING-DUCK (Dendrocygna bicolor) - We were fortunate to track down two birds at Estero Llano Grande.

GREATER WHITE-FRONTED GOOSE (Anser albifrons) – We had a flock of these fly overhead on the appropriately named Goose Island.

AMERICAN WIGEON (Mareca americana)

MALLARD (Anas platyrhynchos) – Wild ones are rare in the RGV but we did have a pair fly past us in Salineno.

NORTHERN PINTAIL (Anas acuta)

GREEN-WINGED TEAL (AMERICAN) (Anas crecca carolinensis)

REDHEAD (Aythya americana)

**RING-NECKED DUCK** (Aythya collaris)

LESSER SCAUP (Aythya affinis)

BUFFLEHEAD (Bucephala albeola)

RED-BREASTED MERGANSER (Mergus serrator)

Cracidae (Guans, Chachalacas, and Curassows)

PLAIN CHACHALACA (Ortalis vetula) – Certainly one of the more iconic birds of the Rio Grande Valley and the northernmost member of the Cracid family.

Odontophoridae (New World Quail)

**NORTHERN BOBWHITE** (Colinus virginianus) – Nice looks at some on the King Ranch.

Phasianidae (Pheasants, Grouse, and Allies)

WILD TURKEY (Meleagris gallopavo) - These were all around the King Ranch!

**COMMON LOON** (Gavia immer)

LEAST GREBE (Tachybaptus dominicus) – Surprisingly few seen on this trip. We had one at Estero and another six at Santa Ana.

**ANHINGA** (Anhinga anhinga) – Four seen at various locations.

Pelecanidae (Pelicans)

AMERICAN WHITE PELICAN (Pelecanus erythrorhynchos)

BROWN PELICAN (Pelecanus occidentalis)

Ardeidae (Herons, Egrets, and Bitterns)

**GREAT BLUE HERON** (Ardea herodias)

**GREAT EGRET** (Ardea alba)

SNOWY EGRET (Egretta thula)

LITTLE BLUE HERON (Egretta caerulea)

TRICOLORED HERON (Egretta tricolor)

REDDISH EGRET (Egretta rufescens) – Some stunning looks at this species near the coast in both dark and white color morphs.

**CATTLE EGRET** (Bubulcus ibis)

**GREEN HERON** (Butorides virescens)

BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT-HERON (Nycticorax nycticorax)

YELLOW-CROWNED NIGHT-HERON (Nyctanassa violacea) – Estero Llano Grande was the place for night herons!

Threskiornithidae (Ibises and Spoonbills)

WHITE IBIS (Eudocimus albus)

WHITE-FACED IBIS (Plegadis chihi) - Four at Estero were the only ones seen.

ROSEATE SPOONBILL (Platalea ajaja) – Some nice views of this colorful species near the coast.

Cathartidae (New World Vultures)

BLACK VULTURE (Coragyps atratus)

TURKEY VULTURE (Cathartes aura)

Pandionidae (Osprey)

**OSPREY** (Pandion haliaetus)

Accipitridae (Hawks, Eagles, and Kites)

WHITE-TAILED KITE (Elanus leucurus) – It was a good trip for this species with especially good looks at Estero.

NORTHERN HARRIER (Circus hudsonius)

SHARP-SHINNED HAWK (Accipiter striatus)

COOPER'S HAWK (Accipiter cooperii)

HARRIS'S HAWK (Parabuteo unicinctus) – South Texas may be the best place on Earth to see this species.

WHITE-TAILED HAWK (Geranoaetus albicaudatus) – We had several good looks, but the one seen on our way back to Corpus Christi was amazing!

**GRAY HAWK** (Buteo plagiatus) – Helen spotted the calling bird near the entrance to Bentsen and we had another one near Salineno.

**RED-SHOULDERED HAWK** (Buteo lineatus) – One was seen at the Santa Margarita Ranch.

BROAD-WINGED HAWK (Buteo platypterus) - Two seen in flight in Kingsville on our way to dinner had eBird reviewers alerted.

SWAINSON'S HAWK (Buteo swainsoni) - Austin spotted the only one of the trip at Santa Ana.

AMERICAN COOT (Fulica americana)

Gruidae (Cranes)

SANDHILL CRANE (Antigone canadensis) - We had a lingering group fly past us on Goose Island.

WHOOPING CRANE (Grus americana) – Close to forty of these magnificent birds were well seen on our boat trip with Tommy Moore aboard the Skimmer.

**BLACK-NECKED STILT** (Himantopus mexicanus)

AMERICAN AVOCET (Recurvirostra americana)

<u>Haematopodidae (Oystercatchers)</u>

AMERICAN OYSTERCATCHER (Haematopus palliatus)

Charadriidae (Plovers and Lapwings)

BLACK-BELLIED PLOVER (Pluvialis squatarola)

AMERICAN GOLDEN-PLOVER (Pluvialis dominica)

WILSON'S PLOVER (Charadrius wilsonia) - We saw six of these hanging out on the mudflats at the Hwy 48 Shrimp Basin.

**SEMIPALMATED PLOVER** (Charadrius semipalmatus)

PIPING PLOVER (Charadrius melodus) - We did pick up one near the Convention Center on South Padre Island.

**KILLDEER** (Charadrius vociferus)

Scolopacidae (Sandpipers and Allies)

LONG-BILLED CURLEW (Numenius americanus)

MARBLED GODWIT (Limosa fedoa)

**RUDDY TURNSTONE** (Arenaria interpres)

SANDERLING (Calidris alba)

**DUNLIN** (Calidris alpina)

PURPLE SANDPIPER (Calidris maritima) – We were fortunate to relocate this rarity at Point Comfort.

LEAST SANDPIPER (Calidris minutilla)

SEMIPALMATED SANDPIPER (Calidris pusilla) – Noteworthy, two seen along Holly Beach Road had wintered locally. Few of this species winter anywhere in the United States.

WESTERN SANDPIPER (Calidris mauri)

SHORT-BILLED DOWITCHER (Limnodromus griseus)

LONG-BILLED DOWITCHER (Limnodromus scolopaceus)

WILSON'S PHALAROPE (Phalaropus tricolor) – At least six of these present at Holly Beach where they apparently overwintered. This species does not normally winter in the US.

SPOTTED SANDPIPER (Actitis macularius)

SOLITARY SANDPIPER (Tringa solitaria)

**GREATER YELLOWLEGS** (Tringa melanoleuca)

WILLET (WESTERN) (Tringa semipalmata inornata) – All of the Willets seen were Westerns. The Easterns were set to arrive any day and breed in the local marshes.

**LESSER YELLOWLEGS** (Tringa flavipes)

Laridae (Gulls, Terns, and Skimmers)

LAUGHING GULL (Leucophaeus atricilla)

FRANKLIN'S GULL (Leucophaeus pipixcan) - We had a single breeding bird at the Brownsville Dump, but it flushed before we could really enjoy it.

RING-BILLED GULL (Larus delawarensis)

HERRING GULL (AMERICAN) (Larus argentatus smithsonianus)

LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULL (Larus fuscus) - One adult was briefly seen at the Brownsville Dump before traffic stirred it off.

**GULL-BILLED TERN** (Gelochelidon nilotica)

CASPIAN TERN (Hydroprogne caspia)

FORSTER'S TERN (Sterna forsteri)

**ROYAL TERN** (Thalasseus maximus)

SANDWICH TERN (Thalasseus sandvicensis) - Our only ones were at the Convention Center mudflats.

BLACK SKIMMER (Rynchops niger)

Columbidae (Pigeons and Doves)

ROCK PIGEON (Columba livia) [I]

**RED-BILLED PIGEON** (Patagioenas flavirostris) – After dipping on these in Salineno we had a terrific experience with them at the Santa Margarita Ranch where I estimated as many as sixteen!

EURASIAN COLLARED-DOVE (Streptopelia decaocto) [I]

COMMON GROUND-DOVE (Columbina passerina)

WHITE-TIPPED DOVE (Leptotila verreauxi)

WHITE-WINGED DOVE (Zenaida asiatica)

MOURNING DOVE (Zenaida macroura)

Cuculidae (Cuckoos)

GREATER ROADRUNNER (Geococcyx californianus)

<u>Strigidae (Owls)</u>

EASTERN SCREECH-OWL (MCCALL'S) (Megascops asio mccallii) – We had a great look at one in a nest box at Estero Llano Grande.

**FERRUGINOUS PYGMY-OWL** (Glaucidium brasilianum) – After a great deal of looking, we eventually connected with a pair of birds on the King Ranch. Such a treat to see this tiny owl.

Caprimulgidae (Nightjars and Allies)

**COMMON PAURAQUE** (Nyctidromus albicollis) – One of the most cryptic of species, we had good looks at a few at Estero.

Trochilidae (Hummingbirds)

RUBY-THROATED HUMMINGBIRD (Archilochus colubris)

BLACK-CHINNED HUMMINGBIRD (Archilochus alexandri)

BUFF-BELLIED HUMMINGBIRD (Amazilia yucatanensis) - Seen on the King Ranch and again at Estero.

Alcedinidae (Kingfishers)

RINGED KINGFISHER (Megaceryle torquata) – It was a good trip for this species with several seen. The most impressive ones were seen from the Santa Margarita bluff.

**BELTED KINGFISHER** (Megaceryle alcyon)

GREEN KINGFISHER (Chloroceryle americana) - We had a single bird at Lions Shelly Park and another at Estero.

Picidae (Woodpeckers)

GOLDEN-FRONTED WOODPECKER (Melanerpes aurifrons)

YELLOW-BELLIED SAPSUCKER (Sphyrapicus varius)

LADDER-BACKED WOODPECKER (Picoides scalaris)

Falconidae (Falcons and Caracaras)

**CRESTED CARACARA** (Caracara cheriway) – South Texas is THE place to see caracara!

AMERICAN KESTREL (Falco sparverius)

**MERLIN** (Falco columbarius) – One went ripping past us on the boat trip.

APLOMADO FALCON (Falco femoralis) - It took some searching, but we connected with this species along Hwy 100.

PEREGRINE FALCON (Falco peregrinus)

Psittacidae (New World and African Parrots)

WHITE-WINGED PARAKEET (Brotogeris versicolurus) – This non-countable bird was still hanging with the parakeet flock in McAllen. [I]

RED-CROWNED PARROT (Amazona viridigenalis)

YELLOW-HEADED PARROT (Amazona oratrix) [I]

WHITE-FRONTED PARROT (Amazona albifrons) [I]

GREEN PARAKEET (Psittacara holochlorus)

<u>Tyrannidae (Tyrant Flycatchers)</u>

NORTHERN BEARDLESS-TYRANNULET (Camptostoma imberbe) – Good look at this species on the King Ranch after a fair bit of searching.

BLACK PHOEBE (Sayornis nigricans) - We saw a single bird hanging out at the Bentsen Headquarters.

EASTERN PHOEBE (Sayornis phoebe)

VERMILION FLYCATCHER (Pyrocephalus rubinus) – A few of these stunning birds seen.

**ASH-THROATED FLYCATCHER** (Myiarchus cinerascens)

**GREAT KISKADEE** (Pitangus sulphuratus) – One of the iconic birds of the Rio Grande Valley. We sure had our fill of these terrific birds.

TROPICAL KINGBIRD (Tyrannus melancholicus)

COUCH'S KINGBIRD (Tyrannus couchii)

SCISSOR-TAILED FLYCATCHER (Tyrannus forficatus) – Our first ones were at the King Ranch and wonderfully plentiful by the tours' end.

Laniidae (Shrikes)

LOGGERHEAD SHRIKE (Lanius ludovicianus)

Vireonidae (Vireos, Shrike-Babblers, and Erpornis)

WHITE-EYED VIREO (Vireo griseus)

YELLOW-THROATED VIREO (Vireo flavifrons) - One was at the Sheepshead migration spot.

**BLUE-HEADED VIREO** (Vireo solitarius)

Corvidae (Crows, Jays, and Magpies)

GREEN JAY (Cyanocorax yncas) – Another one of the great iconic south Texas birds.

CHIHUAHUAN RAVEN (Corvus cryptoleucus)

Hirundinidae (Swallows)

NORTHERN ROUGH-WINGED SWALLOW (Stelgidopteryx serripennis)

PURPLE MARTIN (Progne subis)

TREE SWALLOW (Tachycineta bicolor)

BANK SWALLOW (Riparia riparia) - One was along the Rio Grande.

BARN SWALLOW (Hirundo rustica)

CLIFF SWALLOW (Petrochelidon pyrrhonota)

CAVE SWALLOW (TEXAS) (Petrochelidon fulva pallida) – We saw the birds nesting at the entrance to Bentsen.

Paridae (Tits, Chickadees, and Titmice)

BLACK-CRESTED TITMOUSE (Baeolophus atricristatus)

<u>Remizidae (Penduline-Tits)</u>

VERDIN (Auriparus flaviceps)

Troglodytidae (Wrens)

ROCK WREN (Salpinctes obsoletus) - A singing bird at the Santa Margarita Ranch was a nice find, being scarce in the area.

**HOUSE WREN** (Troglodytes aedon)

MARSH WREN (Cistothorus palustris)

CAROLINA WREN (Thryothorus ludovicianus)

BEWICK'S WREN (Thryomanes bewickii)

CACTUS WREN (Campylorhynchus brunneicapillus)

Polioptilidae (Gnatcatchers)

BLUE-GRAY GNATCATCHER (Polioptila caerulea)

BLACK-TAILED GNATCATCHER (Polioptila melanura) – We connected with one in the desert near Chapeno.

Regulidae (Kinglets)

RUBY-CROWNED KINGLET (Regulus calendula)

<u>Turdidae (Thrushes and Allies)</u>

EASTERN BLUEBIRD (Sialia sialis) - One at Lions Shelly Park and another pair on the King Ranch.

CLAY-COLORED THRUSH (Turdus grayi) – It took forever to connect with this species for some reason, but we ended up seeing at least three up river near Salineno.

Mimidae (Mockingbirds and Thrashers)

**GRAY CATBIRD** (Dumetella carolinensis) – One was at the Convention Center.

CURVE-BILLED THRASHER (Toxostoma curvirostre)

LONG-BILLED THRASHER (Toxostoma longirostre)

NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD (Mimus polyglottos) - No shortage of the state bird of Texas.

Sturnidae (Starlings)

EUROPEAN STARLING (Sturnus vulgaris) [I]

Motacillidae (Wagtails and Pipits)

SPRAGUE'S PIPIT (Anthus spragueii) - We had great looks at one in the pipit field on the King Ranch with Jim.

<u>Bombycillidae (Waxwings)</u>

CEDAR WAXWING (Bombycilla cedrorum) – We had three briefly at Lions Shelly.

Parulidae (New World Warblers)

LOUISIANA WATERTHRUSH (Parkesia motacilla) – A few good looks at migrants.

BLACK-AND-WHITE WARBLER (Mniotilta varia)

ORANGE-CROWNED WARBLER (Oreothlypis celata)

**COMMON YELLOWTHROAT** (Geothlypis trichas)

HOODED WARBLER (Setophaga citrina) - A single stunning male was on South Padre Island.

NORTHERN PARULA (Setophaga americana)

**TROPICAL PARULA** (Setophaga pitiayumi) – We had a female type bird that Javi had found on South Padre Island and a second stunning male singing at Santa Ana!

YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLER (MYRTLE) (Setophaga coronata coronata)

YELLOW-RUMPED WARBLER (AUDUBON'S) (Setophaga coronata auduboni)

YELLOW-THROATED WARBLER (Setophaga dominica) [\*]

BLACK-THROATED GREEN WARBLER (Setophaga virens)

WILSON'S WARBLER (Cardellina pusilla)

Thraupidae (Tanagers and Allies)

WHITE-COLLARED SEEDEATER (Sporophila torqueola) - We had as many as four birds at Salineno, and another pair in Zapata.

Passerellidae (New World Buntings and Sparrows)

CASSIN'S SPARROW (Peucaea cassinii)

SEASIDE SPARROW (Ammodramus maritimus) [\*]

**OLIVE SPARROW** (Arremonops rufivirgatus)

CHIPPING SPARROW (Spizella passerina) [\*]

BLACK-THROATED SPARROW (Amphispiza bilineata) – Many great looks at this stunning species.

LARK SPARROW (Chondestes grammacus)

LARK BUNTING (Calamospiza melanocorys) – We came across a bunch of these near Falcon Heights.

SAVANNAH SPARROW (Passerculus sandwichensis)

LINCOLN'S SPARROW (Melospiza lincolnii)

SWAMP SPARROW (Melospiza georgiana) - One was present at Lion Shelly Park.

Cardinalidae (Cardinals and Allies)

NORTHERN CARDINAL (Cardinalis cardinalis)

PYRRHULOXIA (Cardinalis sinuatus)

**BLUE BUNTING (MIDDLE AMERICA)** (Cyanocompsa parellina beneplacita) – The rarity of the trip was this male spending time at Quinta Mazatlan.

Icteridae (Troupials and Allies)

WESTERN MEADOWLARK (Sturnella neglecta)

EASTERN MEADOWLARK (Sturnella magna)

**HOODED ORIOLE** (Icterus cucullatus) – Birds in the valley are quite orange in color.

ALTAMIRA ORIOLE (Icterus gularis) - Our first were at Bentsen and another pair of birds in Salineno.

AUDUBON'S ORIOLE (Icterus graduacauda) – We had a cooperative pair at the King Ranch and then another at the Santa Margarita Ranch.

**RED-WINGED BLACKBIRD** (Agelaius phoeniceus)

**BRONZED COWBIRD** (Molothrus aeneus)

BROWN-HEADED COWBIRD (Molothrus ater)

BREWER'S BLACKBIRD (Euphagus cyanocephalus) – We had a couple of these at the King Ranch.

**BOAT-TAILED GRACKLE** (Quiscalus major) – One was seen on our boat trip and then we had about 100 or so in the town of Tivoli.

GREAT-TAILED GRACKLE (Quiscalus mexicanus) - Seeing many thousands of these on the wires in McAllen is quite a sight!

Fringillidae (Finches, Euphonias, and Allies)

HOUSE FINCH (Haemorhous mexicanus) - We had four of these at Starr County Park.

LESSER GOLDFINCH (Spinus psaltria)
